
St. John Progressive Missionary Baptist Church December 1, 2024

RESPONSIVE READING: MATTHEW 26:20-30

LEADER: ²⁰Now when the even was come, He sat down with the twelve.

CONGREGATION: ²¹And as they did eat, he said, "Verily I say unto you, that one of you shall betray me."

LEADER: ²²And they were exceeding sorrowful, and began every one of them to say unto him, Lord, is it I?

<u>CONGREGATION:</u> ²³And he answered and said, "He that dippeth his hand with me in the dish, the same shall betray me."

LEADER: ²⁴"The Son of man goeth as it is written of him: but woe unto that man by whom the Son of man is betrayed! It had been good for that man if he had not been born."

<u>CONGREGATION</u>: ²⁵Then Judas, which betrayed him, answered and said, Master, is it I? He said unto him, "Thou hast said."

RESPONSIVE READING: MATTHEW 26:20-30

LEADER: ²⁶And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body."

CONGREGATION: ²⁷And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of it;

LEADER: ²⁸For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins."

<u>CONGREGATION:</u> ²⁹"But I say unto you, I will not drink henceforth of this fruit of the vine, until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom."

<u>ALL TOGETHER:</u> ³⁰And when they had sung an hymn, they went out into the Mount of Olives.

The Lord's Supper

¹⁷ Now in this that I declare unto you I praise you not, that ye come together not for the better, but for the worse.

¹⁸ For first of all, when ye come together in the church, I hear that there be divisions among you; and I partly believe it.

¹⁹ For there must be also heresies among you, that they which are approved may be made manifest among you.

²⁰ When ye come together therefore into one place, this is not to eat the Lord's supper.

²¹ For in eating every one taketh before other his own supper: and one is hungry, and another is drunken.

²²What? have ye not houses to eat and to drink in? or despise ye the church of God, and shame them that have not? what shall I say to you? shall I praise you in this? I praise you not.

²³ For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, that the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread:

²⁴ And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, *Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me.*

²⁶ For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death till he come.

²⁷ Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord.

²⁸ But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of that bread, and drink of that cup.

²⁹ For he that eateth and drinketh unworthily, eateth and drinketh damnation to himself, not discerning the Lord's body.

³⁰ For this cause many are weak and sickly among you, and many sleep.

³¹ For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged.

³² But when we are judged, we are chastened of the Lord, that we should not be condemned with the world.

³³ Wherefore, my brethren, when ye come together to eat, tarry one for another.

³⁴ And if any man hunger, let him eat at home; that ye come not together unto condemnation. And the rest will I set in order when I come.


